Getting Students to Log In

They didn't choose this

Not attending is not necessarily truancy

Lack of confidence in this modality, parent or student, or both

Find out what's okay for their family

Consider webinars for parents on your systems



Reaching out individually to families increases engagement significantly

How confident are you feeling about helping your child with online learning?

What are you struggling with?


