# Step by Step Solutions for Common Tech Issues

Check	Check camera and microphone permissions are enabled and unmuted
Refresh	Refresh your browser and make sure the software is compatible with that browser
Log out	Log out and back into the room
Close	Close the browser and reopen it
Clear	Clear the cache and cookies on your browser
Switch	Switch to a different browser
Restart	Restart your computer
Different	Try a different computer (if available)
Contact	Contact Tech Support for the software you're using

- Rename resources to create a connection
- Place or copy resources where it makes sense to you
